




Women's Day Celebration

The theme of Grade 2 was "ONE LIFE ONE BODY" and all about "AUSTRALIA'


Health is wealth and this is what Grade 2 students explained in the most beautiful way. Very often we forget this and neglect our health, grade 2 students

Grade 2 students were able to convince the audience and made them take a pledge to take time out for themselves and to take care and improve their health.






They taught the audience the African language and kept them engaged through the entire event.
