
Last working day of a very memorable year!

One who is proficient in thala, attains salvation without effort."


Grade-V of BHISK presented their version of Veena after they got to know the emphasis of veena in Indian Classical Music.



Spiral of Theodorus

Representation of irrational numbers on a number line is an interesting activity. Our ninth graders set out to do this and had loads of fun doing it. To better understand the concept of numbers, from the system of rational to the of real numbers, numbers system understanding of irrational numbers is essential. In geometry, the Spiral of Theodorus also called Square Root Spiral or Pythagorean Spiral is a wheel composed of right triangles placed edge-to-edge. An interesting feature of the Spiral of Theodorus is that, though it is a fully unified figure, each new stage reveals a hypotenuse which is either rational or irrational in length. This is shown using the Pythagorean Theorem. The learners appreciated the design illustrating the connection between mathematics and nature while simultaneously comprehending the mystery and beauty of the numbers.
