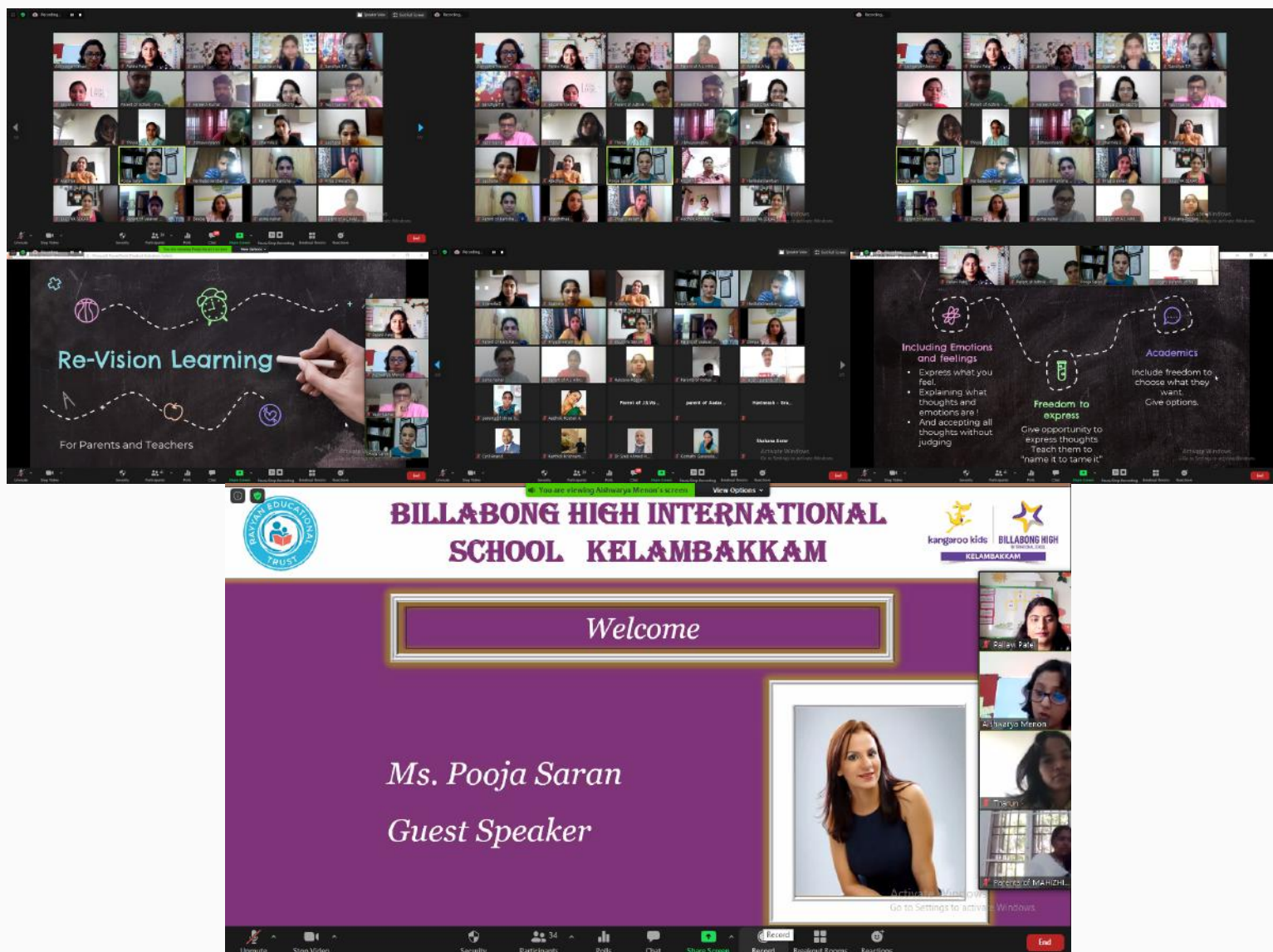


Re-Vision Learning- a Master class for parents and educators - Ms.Aishwarya (Grade 1 Educator)

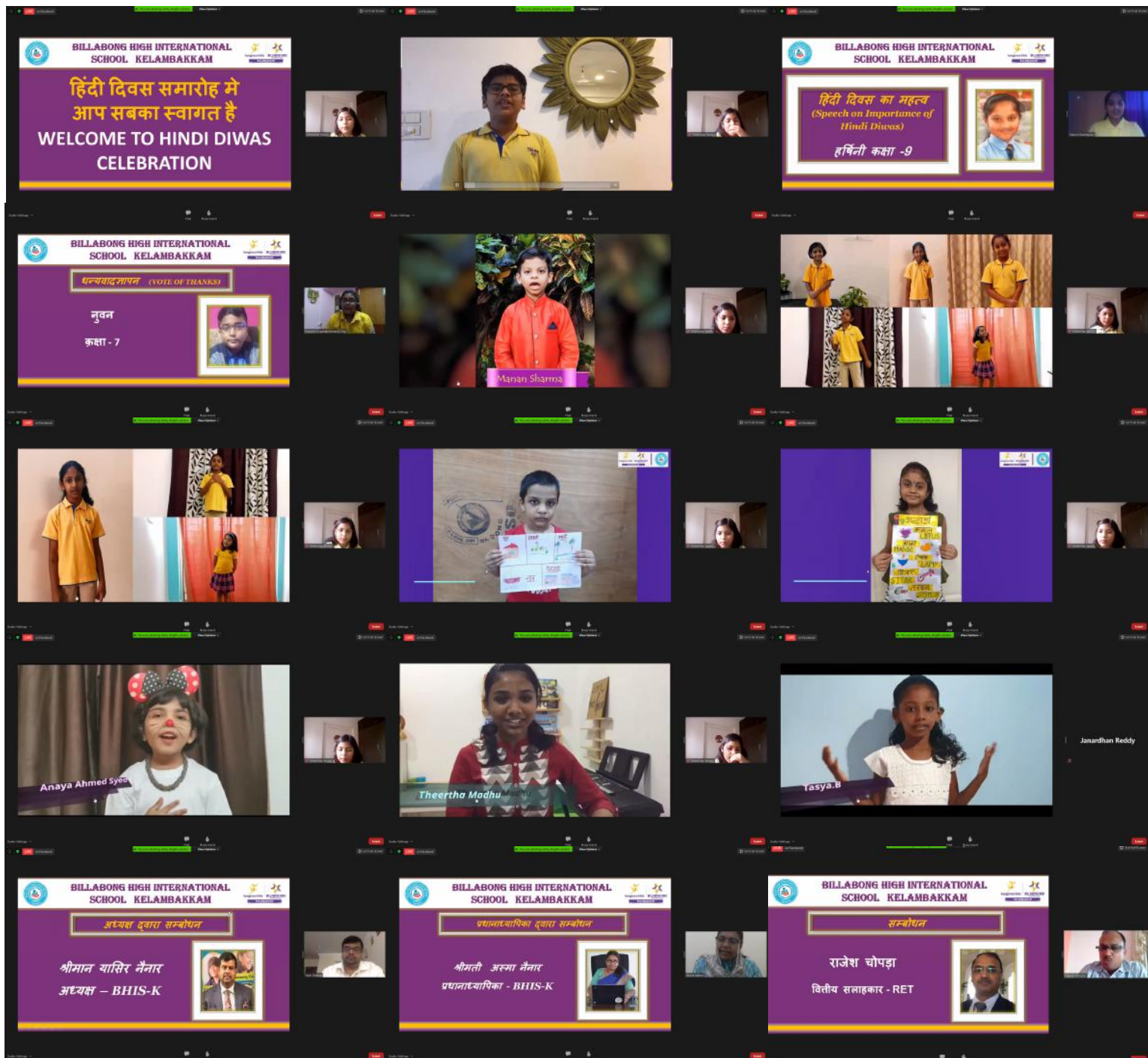
हिंदी दिवस-समारोह

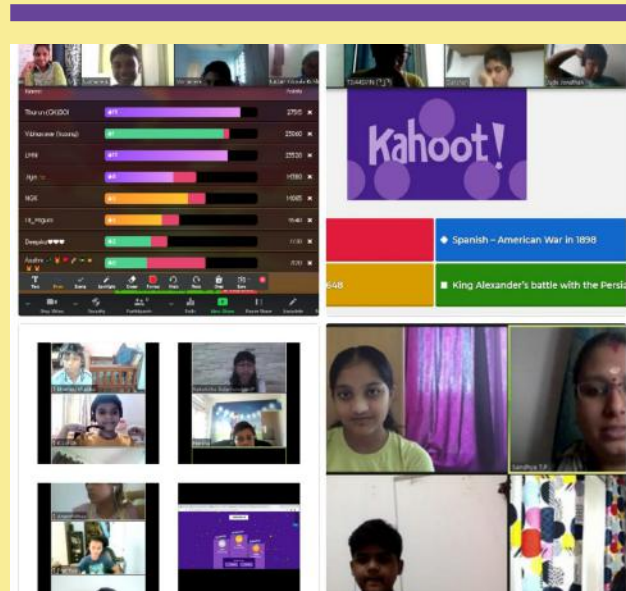

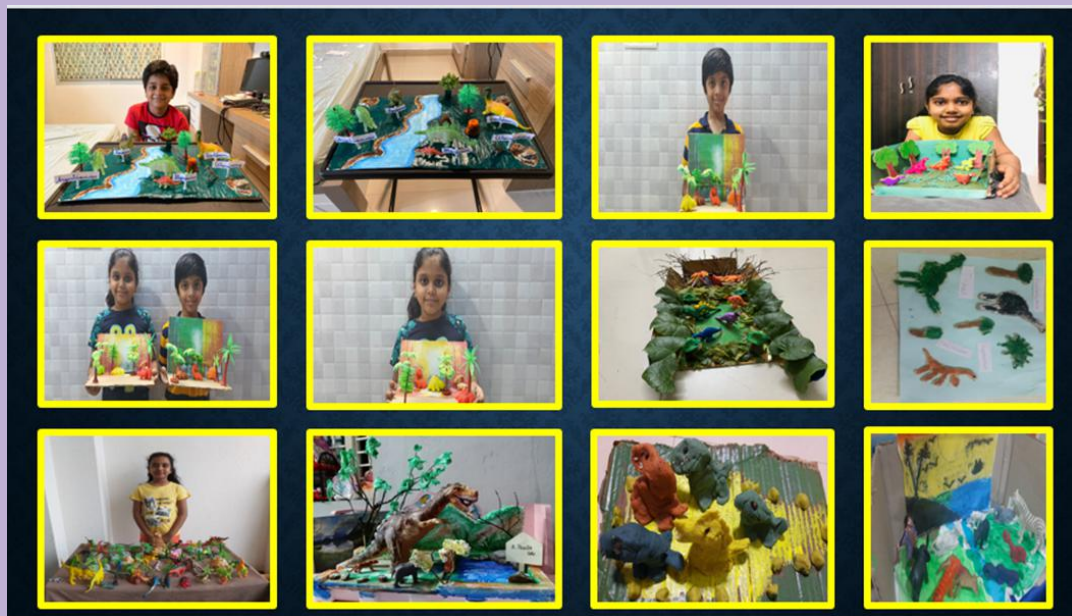
