Grade 4 summarised and recalled the concepts on types of angles and estimating the measure of angles with fun activities. It helped them in registering the learnt concept in a joyful way.


Activity 1: Angles quiz

Vertex and one stationary arm of the angle was drawn on floor using rope. Every student formed angles based on angle type and angle measure called out by the facilitator. Stationary arm was also moved in different directions to challenge the student's understanding.






3D Shapes Overview

We had different 3d shapes , while one student organizes the shapes then it the other have to look at the sequence and find the shape . By this activity we gained mastery over the descriptions of the 3D shapes. The missing number of pieces was identified for the number of block needed to fulfil the shape. An other person was given a chance to guess the missing quater of the 3D shape.


Diwali Celebration at Kindergarten
