Puppetry Show at BHIS-K

Puppets have always fascinated children. This Thursday, the KKEL teachers set out to become the coolest puppet artists ever known. A puppet stage was put forward and the teachers performed a hand puppetry on the famous Panchatantra Story – The Foolish Lion and the clever rabbit. This refreshing activity instilled the toddlers with creativity, imagination and kindled their minds.



Birds and Beaks

BHIS-K believes that children need the freedom to appreciate the infinite resources of their hands, their eyes and ears. The EVS class for Grade 4 was a fun-filled roller-coaster ride. They began by investigating the difference between birds and mammals. Their teacher, Ms Shiny showed them that the bones of Birds were hollow like that of a TT ball thereby reducing its body weight. They then flapped their arms like birds. This helped them experience how the muscles in the shoulders and chest were crucial in helping the birds flap their wings.



Finally, they inspected the different types of beaks of birds by using beak models like chopsticks, tweezers, droppers and spoons. They used the beak models to transfer food items and concluded that various food items determine the adaptation of beaks in birds.
