There was a time when most of us use to pen down our thoughts and save it on a diary... Nowadays, it's much easier using technology.


Yes, BLOG... using our technology (Internet) we can become bloggers; it creates a creative side of a person.

There were various activities happening in all the grades, some of them making Diya's, few making paper crafts related to the festival of lights. This day will remain special in all our hearts.


















